Explanation: Fundamental Duties can be imposed by making laws not through writs. There are several laws like, the prevention of insult of National Honor like National Flag, National Anthem; Various civil and criminal laws which provide punishments for spreading enmity between two groups, Wild Life Protection Act 1971, etc. Fundamental duties became a part of the Constitution in 42 nd amendment act.
